

Craft tip: Bangle / Serviette Ring



What will you need?

- Blancol paste
- Water
- Bowl
- Brush
- Newspaper
- Toilet paper roll
- Scissors
- Paint
- Wiping metal paste / gold-metallic antique wax / polish
- Clear varnish



1. Sprinkle 1 unit in weight of Blancol paste onto 9 units in weight of cold water, stirring constantly.



6. After 5 layers, allow the bangle/serviette ring to dry out completely and decorate: Apply 1 or 2 layers of paint.



2. Stir the paste continuously so that it can develop full effectiveness.



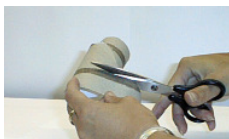
7. Once dry, wipe over with wiping metallic paste or a metallic golden antique polish, and smudge with a handkerchief. Once the paper decoration, paint or polish is dry, seal with a clear varnish. Allow to dry thoroughly before use.



3. Cut the toilet paper roll along the spiral joint.



8. ... and the serviette rings are ready!



4. Cut the roll in half, or to the required size.



Note - To maintain the correct ring shape:

Place the cardboard ring on a bottle/can of about the correct diameter for the arm or required serviette ring when it is almost, but not quite, dry.



5. Tear newspaper into 2 cm-wide strips and dip in the paste. Place the first piece onto the cardboard ring and press down. Slightly overlap the next strip and glue it down. When the cardboard ring has been completely covered by the first layer of pasted paper, leave to dry out thoroughly. Set out the next layer in the same way as the first, but lay the pieces of paper in the opposite direction. Leave to dry out thoroughly. Glue the subsequent layers to the outside of the ring only, so that the inner circumference does not become too small to fit.

Note:

Paint the inner surface with a contrasting colour if you like. Finally, paint the edge in a darker tone to emphasise the contours. Tone-on-tone colours create completely different effects from contrasting colours.
